Revision of Addition and Subtraction (Wk 1)

Number and place value to 50 (Wk 2-3) – Counting forwards and backwards, representing, one more and one less, comparing and ordering

Counting in 2s and 5s (Wk 4) – Counting in multiples of 2s and 5s up to 50 (100 as a challenge)

Length and Height (Wk 5) – comparing, measuring, using a ruler, adding and subtracting lengths

Weight and volume (Wk 6-7) – introduction to weight and mass, measuring, comparing, solving problems, introduction to capacity and volume

Please help at home by practising writing the numerals 0-50 neatly and correctly with your child and counting forwards and backwards within 50. Count different objects at home and record the amount you count. If your child is confident, try numerals beyond 50. Also, see how you can talk to your child about different types of measurement around the home!
