

## **Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) Reporting to Parents 2020-21**

At Crossways Junior School we strive to ensure that every child meets their full potential. The Government is giving money to schools to help children from lower income families do their very best. This funding is called a 'Pupil Premium' and is designed to ensure that every child has a greater opportunity to reach their potential. Here at Crossways, we are determined to give every child the start they need to make a success of their lives. We have planned to use the Pupil Premium Grant for children based upon their individual need; following a process of consultation between the class teacher, SENDCo, Head Teacher and any other members of the team around the child. We feel that it is this personal touch that makes Crossways such an effective institution at overcoming learning barriers.

For every child registered on Free School Meals, Crossways Junior School will receive £1,345 in 2020-21. With this money the school plans to enrich education for targeted pupils by providing a range of additional opportunities, for example:

- Supporting the cost of educational visits
- Supporting the cost of enrichment opportunities (clubs/music lessons)
- Supporting the cost of out of hours care (Breakfast and After School Club)
- Specific educational resources
- 1:1 tuition
- Small group interventions
- Uniform needs
- Dedicated SENDCo and Pupil Premium management time
- Release time for teachers to meet 1:1 with pupils to discuss their learning/progress/pastoral issues
