Covid-19 had a significant impact on our planned Committee and Full Governing Board meetings. There were 9 Full Governing Board meetings, 1 Pupil Development Committee meeting. The Finance & Resources Committee kept to its schedule of 4 meetings, due mainly to the legal obligations of the committee. The Staff Development Committee, comprised of governors who are members of either of the other two committees did not meet this year. Since the Covid lockdown until the end of Term 6, all meetings were held "virtually". The Executive Headteacher, Mark Toogood, resigned at Christmas. Paul Medlicott and Hazel Packer were appointed Acting Headteachers for the remainder of the academic year and were co-opted onto the Board of Governors. They, as did Mark Toogood, attended all committee meetings and Full Governing Board meetings during their time as Governors. Emma Hillyer's surname changed to Chivers on her marriage.

In addition to the above timetabled meetings governors also gave up their free time to serve on panels where at least one governor was required and/or meet with teachers in their role as link between the schools in specific areas and/or attend courses to improve their effectiveness. Emma Aiken-Jones (Chair of Governors) and Sarah Wickett (Vice-Chair) attended many meetings in connection with the schools' management of Covid-19.
